But another Democrat politician, Barack Obama, is hoping to compete with Clinton and become the first black US President.

• **Jungle girl**

CD: It seems a girl who disappeared 19 years ago has been found living wild in the jungle of Cambodia in South East Asia.

She went missing when she was just 8 years old. Her father says he recognises her because of a scar on her arm.

Police describe her as half human and half animal.

They say she cannot talk and, when she was found, she was naked and walking like a monkey.

• **Mind your language**

CD: A school in Landskrona has told pupils they are only allowed to speak Swedish.

Nearly half of the pupils have immigrant backgrounds. The school is the first in the country to ban all other languages on the premises.

The only exception is in language lessons. The headteacher says the rule means every one will be able to understand each other.

But some people think it is wrong to ban people from being able to speak their native language.

• **What a scorcher!**

CD: The weather forecast for 2007 is going to be good. In fact, it's going to be the hottest year ever.

It may be winter now, but experts say summer temperatures will be very high.

They say there are two environmental reasons for this. Firstly, we have more greenhouse gasses in the air.

Secondly, there is something called the El Niño effect, which causes unusually high temperatures around the world.
