## Discussion points:

**Dealing with fake news:** How would you explain fake news? Where do you think it comes from? Have you ever been convinced by news that later turned out to be fake? Find out more about news detection. What are some signs to show that news is fake? Do you think fake news is mostly prevalent on the internet or has it come in to mainstream media (such as radio and television) as well. Do you trust mainstream media such as the news you see on television or hear on the radio? Why or why not? How can fake news be combatted?

**Universal Basic Income:** Canada and Finland are two countries that have begun talks about implementing a basic income for all citizens. This means that a small amount of money would be given to all citizens each month regardless of their income. What do you think of the idea of a Universal Basic Income? Find out more about UBI and make a list of advantages and disadvantages. Take a position for or against and set up a debate with your peers where one group argues for UBI and one group argues against.

**Empathy through technology:** Lual Mayen has created a game in which players take on the identity of a refugee. Do you think video games have the power to teach empathy and to make players understand what it is like to be someone else? Why do you think Mayen's game has been so successful? Can you think of other ways in which people can "step into somebody else's shoes"?

- 1) Suggestion: Even though more knowledge and information is available to people than ever before, there is an increase in conspiracy theories, misinformation and fake news.
- 2) Suggestion: The website looked dodgy as it was heavily pixelated and the text was not well spaced.
- 3) Suggestion: It checks facts to either verify them or refute them.
- 4) Suggestion: Formula E is a racing competition that uses only electric cars. It would like to hold races all across Africa and not just in one place, like now, in Marrakesh.
