Discussion points

Gender neutral or gender specific:

The leaking of the document about unisex bathrooms in South Africa has led to massive protests and the signing of petitions. It was also suggested that teachers must stop dividing classes into girls and boys.

- How do you feel about the situation in South Africa? What is the situation at your school? Do you have unisex bathrooms? If yes, how do you feel about them? If no, would you like to have them?
- Do you know of any other examples where girls and boys are divided in this way? If you do, what do you think the reasoning behind the division is? Do you agree with it?
- Do you know of any other ways to protect people who consider themselves gender neutral? What else can we do to make them feel accepted and at home?
- In the program, the risk of gender neutral individuals committing suicide is mentioned. According to the Public Health Agency in Sweden, 1226 committed suicide in 2021 and another 279 people died where suicide was a suspected cause. Out of those people, 11 were children under the age of 15. The risk of suicide is higher among trans an non-binary persons. 57 percent of all trans people aged 15-19 have seriously considered suicide on at least one occasion during the past 12 months whereas in the population as a whole, the figure is six percent. What can we do to try and prevent suicide from happening?

Physical and mental preparations:

"Winning doesn't start at the venue" says chess master Abimbola Osunfuyi. He talks about preparations, alertness and building up to be in great shape for a competition. He stresses the importance of exercise.

- How do you prepare for important events? Do you eat anything specific? Exercise? Do you have a mantra?
- Do you have different ways of preparing depending on whether the important event has to do with sports, school, or other important events like for instance a job interview?
- What advice would you give to someone who was preparing for a life-changing event? If that person was about to compete as a professional athlete for the first time? If they were about to sit an exam that would determine their grade and possibly their entry into upper secondary or university? If they were about to join the military? If someone was about to get married? Discuss your answers in small groups, then share them with the class.
