- I
- Nationalities
- Religions
- Languages
- Ethnicities: groups of people with common national, tribal, religious, linguistic, or cultural origin
- Titles of people
- Titles of books, videogames, films...
- Names
- Geographical locations: cities, countries, states, oceans, rivers, mountains, deserts...
- Historical periods, like the Middle Ages or Classical Greece
- Days, months, holidays
