- **Mass shootings at New Zealand mosques**

Jacinda Ardern: This is and will be one of New Zealand's darkest days

This is New Zealand's Prime Minister, Jacinda Ardern, in response to the mass shootings at two crowded mosques in Christchurch on March 15th. Taken from CNN.

The terror attack killed at least 50 people, and at least 50 are seriously injured. The shootings took place during Friday Prayer, an important part of the week for Muslim communities who gather in the mosque.

A witness spoke to the BBC:

Witness: I was hearing shooting after shooting after shooting. It went on about 6 minutes or more. And I could hear screaming and crying

The witness was able to escape the mosque during the attack. He explains that he could hear lots of shooting as well as people crying and screaming.

28-year-old Brenton Tarrant, an Australian citizen, has been charged with murder.

Lynnette Smith: Although some schools and most schools really will have some sex education, no way is it advanced as it should be and also the training isn't always there.

Salika: I think it's good that they're putting more information out there for the younger kids because most parents, you know they don't really talk about it with their children.

Toby: I think it's really important that they've made it mandatory.
