• Kenyan Science teacher wins global prize

Peter Tabichi, a science teacher from rural Kenya has won a \$1 million prize for the world's best teacher. Kenya CitizenTV explains why:

Presenter: Due to his exceptional personality, of giving away 80% of his income to the poor and orphans

Tabichi sees science as a way out of poverty. The children he's teaching have few books and his classes are often crowded with 70 pupils.

• And now, what's happening with Brexit?

On Saturday 23rd March, hundreds of thousands gathered in London calling for another EU referendum. These people don't want to leave the EU and they want to vote on it again. Let's listen to why some protestors attended:

Protester: Because I'm extremely passionate about not leaving the European Union

Protester: I think it's an important cause. I think we got to learn that we the people have power and I think that's what these marches show

Protester: Why can't we not all be in the union?

But what's happening in parliament? After losing two votes on the Brexit deal, Prime Minister, Theresa May, asked Members of Parliament to back the

withdrawal agreement. This agreement includes issues like citizens' rights and the Northern Ireland border. Listen to May ask for support from MPs moments before the voting took place – taken from the BBC:

Theresa May: This is the last opportunity to guarantee Brexit

Voting took place on the day the UK was originally scheduled to leave the EU – the 29th March. But the withdrawal agreement was defeated by a majority of 58 votes. This means May's deal was rejected for a third time.

Announcer: The ayes to the right 286, the noes to the left 344

Immediately after the result, Jeremy Corbyn, leader of the Labour party, said May 'must go' and called for a general election:

Jeremy Corbyn: She must go not an in determined date in the future but now so that we can decide the future of this country through a general election.

On the day of the vote in parliament thousands of leave supporters from across the UK walked the streets of London to protest against the Brexit delay.

Protesters: Shame on you, Shame on you, Shame on you'

Sky News spoke to pro-Brexites during the march

Protester: It's just wrong. What they're doing in there is not democracy

Protester: I think that's disgraceful that we've not left yet. I think it's unlawful and I think we should leave.

But the battle is far from over. There is still the possibility of a no deal Brexit or a further extension, which means the UK would take part in the EU elections.
