The National Trust's Dark History

The National Trust is a charity here in the UK that looks after important old buildings.

A report but the Trust has shown that over 90 of the houses they look after were once owned by people who made money from slavery.

Mariam Rasheed is 19, and has just started University in the UK. I had a phone call with her.

MARLAM: "Well, obviously I'm shocked. I mean for the National Trust, which is probably one of the biggest conservation charities in Europe, for them to have links to colonial expansion and plantation owners, that is quite a shocking revelation."

KATE: Do you think you should have been taught this in school?

MARLAM: "I definitely think that this should be taught in schools. It's so important to know as a society the links that we still have to a colonial past."

The National Trust now think it's important that people learn about how many people here were involved in buying and selling other human beings.

Now, Home Girls Unite

Home Girls is a charity that helps vulnerable young girls from families which have moved to this country from abroad.

They have just started a 'therapy fund'.

The money they raise will be used to give the girls emotional support and treatment for any mental health problems they suffer from being the oldest immigrant daughter.

KITTY: "Essentially when I was 18 my parents moved to Australia. So, my little sister, she is 2,5 years younger than me...I have effectively like raised her, and I feel like my parents weren't able to be the parents that they needed to be"

Kitty there, a member of Home Girls Unite, speaking about how she raised her younger sister when her parents relocated to Australia.

KITTY: "It wasn't even a conversation, with any immigrant parents...I feel like I'm from south Asia so there is a lot responsibility that is unsaid between like a child and their parents. My parents never sat me down and like: look we expect you to look after Shalu, that's my little sister"

Kitty feels as though her parents didn't speak to her about their decision to move abroad, which meant she had to look after her little sister.
