### **COP26 in Glasgow**

Now, what do you think has been the biggest story of the year. Here's 13-year-old George with his opinion.

*George: The most important societal issue of the year would have to be Cop26. It really reflects what's going to happen in the future.*

At the huge global summit – Cop26 - in Glasgow this October and November - world leaders came together to make deals and promises to try to limit climate change.

I spoke to two young activists who shared their hopes and fears for what the summit could achieve. Evie told me:

*EVIE: I think countries are definitely paying more attention to scientists and are listening a lot more to concerns about climate change. But there's still a long way to go.*

And Mia told me that things had to change.

### **Whistleblower at Facebook**

Also making headlines this year was the multi-billion-dollar company Facebook – now known as 'Meta'. The social media company was in the news because of a former employee called Frances Haugen.

Frances Haugen was worried about the effects that the platform, Instagram, was having on young women's self-esteem and also eating disorders.

Here she is talking to US TV Network CBS:

FRANCES HAUGEN: *Facebook's own research says – it is not just that Instagram is dangerous for teenagers, that it harms teenagers. It is that it is distinctly worse than other forms of social media.*

Facebook deny all her accusations. I caught up with 17-year-old, Olivia, to get her take on it.

Kate: *What's the worst kind of content you see?*

Olivia: *Unrealistic body image stuff.*

Kate: *What did you think of the claims that Frances Haugen has made about Facebook?*

Olivia: *I don't think it really surprises me – they can profit from it more.*

Kate: *What do you think Facebook could do to help this situation?*

Olivia: *Well, the stuff that is potentially harmful, they could try and restrict it - they shouldn't actively try and share it.*

### **Sports**

George: *The biggest moments for me in sport would have had to be the Euros.*

Ana: *After I watched one game of the Euros I was really hooked.*

For England football fans this summer was one they will never forget. The national team got to a major final for the first time since 1966. And although they lost to Italy on penalties, the team were an inspiration to football fans around the country.

*Sky Brown: It’s so cool because I got to be on the podium with my friends, Kokona and Sakura. And just being in Tokyo and spending time in the village...this is honestly one of my best memories.*

Two weeks after the Olympics the Paralympics took place.

Penny Briscoe, who leads the British Paralympic team told the BBC:

*Penny Briscoe: We’re here to do the nation proud, to do ourselves proud and create you know lots of medal moments but also lots and lots of memories for the British public as well.*

## **Music and Cinema**

Now, I don’t know about you, but for me and many others in the UK, being able to go to the cinema again this year was a big occasion!

And it didn’t get much bigger than when the new James Bond film ‘No Time to Die’ was finally released at the end of September.

*Ana: We went to see James Bond on one of the first nights that it came out and it was such a cool experience.*

*George: The mood of the song fit the film really well.*

The singer creating that mood was the American singer Billie Eilish.

The 19-year old has had an amazing year, and we reported in October that she will be the youngest ever solo performer to headline the famous music festival, Glastonbury, next year.
