# Why young people are buying fewer cheap clothes

More and more young people in the UK are rejecting 'fast fashion'.

Fast fashion is when clothes are made cheaply and in factories, usually in the Far East. Some of these factories are called sweat shops because people there work in difficult conditions and are paid very little.

These clothes are also linked to climate change because they quickly end up in rubbish dumps.

I spoke to Nyla who is a young person from New Zealand who lives in the UK.

She mostly wears second hand clothes and doesn't like fast fashion. Nyla, why do you not like fast fashion?

Nyla: Fast fashion really encourages you to spend big, wear for a short period of time and then continuously rotate your wardrobe, which is just not a sustainable solution at all for the environment.

Nyla says fast fashion is bad because it encourages you to buy more clothes.

Nyla uses apps to buy and sell second hand clothes online. Why do you sell clothes online, Nyla?

Nyla: I wanted to be able to make charity shopping or thrift shopping easier for people. And therefore, I'm hoping that it's encouraging more people to buy second-hand, which is gentler on the environment.

Nyla says she sells second hand clothes because it is 'gentler' on the environment.

I also spoke to Annabelle who wears mostly second hand or vintage clothes.
