Women's football has grown in popularity in the UK after England won this year's UEFA European Championship.

The England men's team's last international tournament win was back in 1966.

Women in the UK were actually banned from playing football professionally between 1921 and 1971 but almost all major clubs now have a women's team.

A new football season has started in the UK, and nearly 48 thousand people went to the Arsenal vs Tottenham Hotspur women's match on the 24th September – a record for a women's club match.

I went to the match at the Emirates Stadium in North London to speak to some young people. I asked Becca, who is 21 years old, why she thinks women's football has increased in popularity.

Becca: With the England women, especially winning the Euros, I feel like everyone's actually realising, 'wow, women can play football', and obviously more money's been put into it, which is good to see.

Kate: How did it make you feel to see so many people here?

Becca: Very proud, like even seeing the men, seeing the kids, seeing everyone actually coming to support the football, Arsenal and women it's inspirational, to be honest. It's good to see.

Kate: Do you play football, Becca?

Becca: I used to. And then I came to uni and I just stopped.

Kate: Do you think you'll start playing again?

Becca: Yes, genuinely. I've said this for two years now that I want to get back and play and seeing it today, that's every little girl's dream really, who likes football.

I also spoke to 15 year old Imogen

Kate: What do you think about the rise in popularity of women's football?

Imogen: I think it's good because for quite a few years, obviously, men's football has been much bigger than women's. But obviously today and the amount of people attending, it was really good.

Kate: What impressed you about today's game?
