Police strip searches

According to a report, children as young as eight are being strip searched by police.

The children's commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza, revealed almost three thousand children were strip searched in England and Wales from 2018 to 2022.

This report was done after the scandal involving a young black girl who was strip searched on school grounds whilst she was on her period, which sparked outrage across the country.

Black children were six times more likely to be strip searched, and over 52% of these searches were done without an appropriate adult's presence, which is a legal requirement.

Over half of these searches lead to no further action. Dame Rachel de Souza said these statistics were 'utterly unacceptable'.

The leader of the Labour Party, Keir Starmer, revealed its five core policies recently, as a way of 'Powering Up Britain'. One of these policies includes tackling the climate crisis. The secretary for climate change, and former Labour Party leader, Ed Milliband, said that they want to copy the US's plan to create more jobs that are related to helping the environment.

The fact that they've had to publish this Powering Up Britain's strategy after being judged last July by the High Court that the plan wasn't detailed enough. Well, I think that says it all for me.

Carrie: And what about you, Sophie?

Sophie: Unless there is a huge fundamental shift in the mindset of the voters and the climate becomes the biggest priority, once we've put out all of the various fires that the Conservative Party have created, such as the cost of living crisis, the further fallout from Brexit and COVID and everything else, then yes, maybe the impending collapse of the planet in 20 to 30 years will become a priority.
