I've been speaking with performers in London to hear their thoughts on what happened. I first talked to Alex, who is training to be an orchestra conductor.

Carrie: Alex, what was your reaction when you saw the story?

Alex: *My first reaction was not surprised at all because these protests by Just Stop Oil are becoming more and more frequent.*

Alex wasn't surprised when he read the story, as many similar protests have been happening in the UK. I also spoke with Amy, who is an actor.
