Online gaming can be a toxic environment.

The computer game company, Ubisoft, have published a guide aimed at stopping abusive behaviour.

The Good Game Playbook will be sent to players who've been reported for bullying other players.

I've been talking to young gamers here in the UK, to find out what they think about this issue. I first spoke with Josh.

Carrie: What's your experience with online gaming and online abuse?

Josh: *Yeab, I've absolutely seen this kind of behaviour online. I think the worst abuse I've seen has been a lot of really nasty racism.*

Jeremy says they received homophobic abuse when playing an online game during Pride Month.

Carrie: And why do you think this behaviour happens when playing these sorts of games?

Jeremy: *Well, 'cause we live in a society that tells people, especially men, that they should bottle up their feelings and it all just explodes.*

Jeremy says because men are often told to hide their feelings in real life, they express their feelings online.

Carrie: And what do you think, Josh?

Josh: *People get frustrated and when you can't see the person that you're frustrated with, you forget that's another person when you're messaging people.*

Josh thinks online behaviour is so bad because people forget that other players are real people.
