School holidays cut short

A new report by an education charity is calling for school summer holidays in England to be cut to just 4 weeks.

At the moment pupils get around 6 weeks off over the summer.

But researchers at the Nuffield Foundation say that some pupils, in particular those from more disadvantaged backgrounds, find it hard to get back into lessons after such a long break.

Sexist videos on TikTok

Now do you ever see sexist videos on social media?

Researchers from University College London and the University of Kent saw a big rise in sexist material appearing on the "For You" pages of TikTok accounts.

Doctor Kaitlyn Regehr, who worked on the report, said that the platform's algorithms target people's weaknesses and make harmful content seem normal.

And what do young people in the UK think about this? I went into London to find out. I first spoke with Cameron.

Carrie: Cameron, have you seen this sexist content online?

Cameron: I have seen misogynist posts on social media, mostly on TikTok. As a young man who's interested in sports and football in the UK, they came upon onto my feed, which is when I stopped using it.

Cameron says he used to use TikTok, but stopped because the app was showing him more and more of this sexist content. I also spoke with Lisa.

Lisa: I try and avoid it as much as possible. I do get it sometimes popping up on my feed, because obviously the minute you click on something, you watch it for a few seconds, or you comment. And then you see it everywhere.

Carrie: Cameron, why do you think people are so taken in by these videos?

Cameron: I think young men get taken into it so easily... it's more just because it's so viciously targeted at them. The people who make the misogynistic content in general are making money off them. So, it's a business.

Cameron thinks that creators who make this content just want to make money by promoting these views to young men.
